

Master's Programme with a specialisation in English Literature (120 university credits), Autumn 2017

Welcome to the Master's Programme with a specialisation in English Literature at the Department of English, Stockholm University. We look forward to an exciting and demanding two years of study with you in our programme.

The first term of studies consist of:

- two obligatory, programme-specific courses during the first half of the term: Introduction to Literary Interpretation (7.5 ECTS credits) and Scientific Method and Research Ethics (7.5 ECTS credits). The former is organised by the Department of Culture and Aesthetics and includes a lecture series along with seminars given by the Department of English. The latter is given by the Department of Philosophy.
- two obligatory courses in your main field of study during the second half of the term:
 Narrative Theory and Approaches to Realism (7.5 ECTS credits each). These are both given by the Department of English.

Further information, including full schedules and literature, for courses given on advanced level by the Department of English is available on our website.

On **Monday 28 August at 9 am**, you are invited to a meeting for all new MA students at the Department of English. The meeting will take place in room E890 (Staff room, 8th floor of the E-building in Södra Huset) and will be an opportunity for us to get acquainted with each other and for any questions that you may have.

After the meeting on 28 August, at **1 pm**, you will have the **introductory seminar** for the course *Introduction to Literary Interpretation*. The lecture series begins later in the week (see schedule on website) in the auditorium at "Humanistvillan" Frescativägen 24 (previously Manne Siegbahn-Laboratoriet). Details and dates for subsequent lectures and seminars are available on the schedule found on Department of English website.

The course given by the Department of Philosophy is obligatory within all MA programmes at the Faculty of Humanities at Stockholm University. Information about their course is available on their <u>website</u>.

Registration

Please note that you must register for the programme in August.

Online registration for the obligatory courses (and thereby the MA programme) will be open between **10 and 20 August**¹. You can register online if you have an activated university account and are accepted to the programme without conditions. Instructions on how to register online is available on the Department of English website.

If you don't have an activated university account, you can activate it <u>online</u> but only if you have a Swedish national identification number. Information for international students on how to active your account will be provided during the <u>University Orientation Week</u> but is also available on the <u>Stockholm University website</u>. Orientation week is designed to introduce international students to the University and studies in Sweden, with an <u>Orientation Day</u> in the afternoon of 25 August.

If you need assistance with registration, you are welcome to come in to our Department (room **E839 or E832**, house E, floor 8) on **25 August** between 11 am and 12 noon and we will assist you. Please bring a valid **photo ID**. Please also note that if you have been conditionally accepted to the programme, the conditions need to have been fulfilled for you to commence your studies. If you are unsure of the conditions, please contact the coordinator or our Student Affairs Office (contact details below).
