## Research Profile

Christina is a semanticist, and her research interest is focused on various aspects of polysemy. As a result of the complex character of polysemy, her research concerns many areas of language studies: syntax, morphology, word formation, idioms and idiom variation, the concept of construction, certain aspects of phonology and phonetics, discourse and text analysis, stylistics, rhetoric, terminology, and, not least, the relation between semantics, pragmatics, semiotics, cognitive science, and cultural studies.

Another focal area in Christina's research orientation concerns the character of and the relation between different theoretical and methodological frameworks within linguistics, in particular aspects of them that are to do with the role of meaning in the constitution and use of language, or different languages.

Questions about distinctions between research frameworks as well as their many – at least partly – shared qualities which allow constructive integration and development of linguistic research tools are of central importance in two monograph projects (see below).
